It was 40° below zero that A.M. with lots of snow

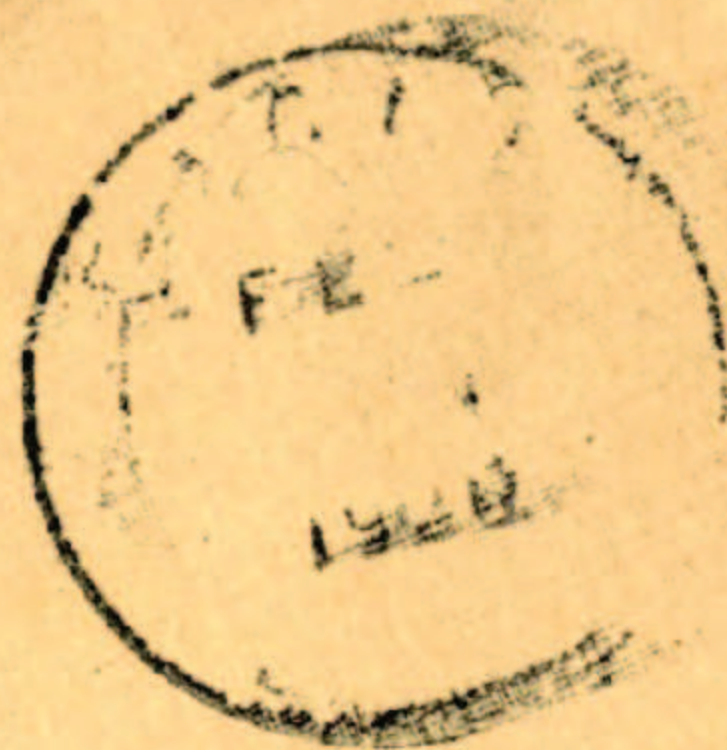
He were sorry to hear of the death of Mr. Michael's
mother. I was called home to Neb. by the death
of my Mother May 8th. I tried to call you up when
in the Union Sta. Denver, but couldn't get an
ans. Had to wait from 7³⁰ A.M. to 1¹⁵ P.M. & wanted
to get to see you or phone at least. It was raining
& so cold. I felt like cleaning up on that bunch
of phone operators there in the station. Was gone
only 2 weeks as it is so hard to leave the children at
home, & enjoy a visit away & harder still to

travel with children. Just took the baby.
Did you hear of the death of Mr. Tracy at Gypsum
lately? He leaves his wife penniless. Seems so
hard on her, & so unnecessary. He has been
making \$150. a mo as Co. Road Overseer for 2 or 3 yrs.
She always worked so hard.

Henry hasnt any funds to sell this yr when
they are so high. It has only been working by the
month for Holverson for the last 2 yrs. The 3 yrs
we leased the poor market charled us out.

How is the carpentering business in Denver?
Does Mr. M. keep busy? Henry talks about
going back to carpentering, but there is so little
work here & they just pick up the cheapest material
to do it. No new good houses going up, a log house
or shack sometimes is all. Halverson went down
to the stock show to buy some feeder cattle for his
cheap hay, but the cattle are too high. His wife was in
May Bros. Hosp. in Minn. in Nov. for operation for
